The Zagame Adelaide Motorsport Experience

5-7 December 2019

The inaugural Zagame Adelaide Motorsport Experience is an event like no other.

Starting on track at Australia's newest world-class race circuit, The Bend Motorsport Park, drivers will have the chance to enjoy their vehicle in a controlled environment. The tips learnt on track can then be finessed during the exclusive Zagame Tour of the three-day Adelaide Rally.

There, you will be led on the closed road stages by our experienced tour leaders, driving at a good pace along some of South Australia's most spectacular roads. The atmosphere will be highly social and non-competitive, all whilst enjoying signature Zagame premium hospitality throughout.

Zagame owners will be among the front groups to depart daily, allowing for shorter wait times and earlier finishes. At the end of the day relax and unwind, with newly made friends at private Zagame group evenings.

Participating in the Zagame Adelaide Motorsport Experience

To participate in the Zagame Tour, owners must be driving a vehicle with current road registration, purchased or serviced with Zagame Automotive Group.

Event overview

The Zagame Tour is a three-day tour event running from Thursday 5 December to Saturday 7 December. Nowhere in Australia is there a tour with so many separate activities packed into three days. This year the event will feature up to 23 closed road stages for Touring categories with the longest stage length being 22km, this being the iconic Marble Hill Stage run on the Friday. The Tours will traverse over 600kms over 3 days of which near 135km will be closed road activity.

Zagame Tour participants will run near the front of the field in the Main Tour, running ahead of the field of competitors and the Zagame Tour will be the first tour on the road to enter the East End Finale at the conclusion of the event. The Zagame Tour packet will have expert tour leaders setting an enjoyable pace on challenging, serpentine roads that typically contain a mix of hairpins, flowing and linked corners. These roads normally have a very low average speed due to the high amount of corners they contain, delivering an exhilarating experience with the freedom of using both sides of the road.

Entrants are embraced as a key part of the Adelaide Rally and vehicles are displayed on all occasions, including the famous Gouger Street Party and East End Finale' Party in the heart of Adelaide.

Navigator

A Navigator is mandatory for participation on the Zagame Tour. They will be responsible for directing the driver on all sections of the Main Tour, noting that participating cars must have the same Navigator for all three days of the Tour. Navigators will be provided a commemorative Road Book with full details for each stage of the tour including times, directions, distances and signage. Previous rally navigation experience is not mandatory.

Licensing

This event will operate under a CAMS (Confederation of Australian Motorsport) Event Permit and as a result you will require a CAMS Speed Level 2 License. The LS2 is a basic motorsport license entitling the owner to compete in events such as education track events, observed section trials, touring assemblies and non-timed road events.

If you are currently a member of a CAMS affiliated car club, and/or hold a CAMS license of any type, please let one of our team know. Zagame Automotive is pleased to advise we can facilitate Sporting Car Club of SA membership and a temporary „single event“ Level 2 License for competitors which will cover the Zagame Tour at no extra cost.

Insurance

Comprehensive vehicle insurance is the responsibility of the vehicle owner/driver and may be invalid on closed roads during the event. We strongly recommend that you contact your provider to ensure you have an adequate level of insurance for the event.

Liability

Participants are liable for the first \$10,000 of any property damage caused by them within the event. Participants are completely liable for their own vehicle and at no time is the event or Zagame Automotive Group

responsible for damage or loss caused to vehicles or participants themselves. Participants will be required to sign a waiver pre-event.

Attire

Please ensure you are wearing closed footwear and clothing to cover from collar to wrists and ankles (must be non-synthetic material). Zagame Automotive Group will provide a complimentary 100% cotton top for both Driver and Navigator.

Safety

It is a requirement of participation that all vehicles are fitted with hazard triangles, a first aid kit and fire extinguisher (minimum 1kg). Zagame Automotive Group will loan these to participants for installation at the pre-event inspection, and removal post event. Installation of the Fire Extinguisher will **not** modify your vehicle.

The Lead and Follow Cars will carry Oil Spill Kits and 2-way radios.

Car Preparations

- Participation is in your own vehicle and only registered participants will be permitted in the Rally.
- Please ensure that you have cleared all loose items from your car before you arrive at *parc ferme*.
- It is your responsibility to ensure that your vehicle is mechanically fit for drive activities. This includes ensuring that fluid levels are correct, there is sufficient braking performance for speed application, and there are no warning lights for key vehicle functions. The vehicle must be in full working order to within the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Please ensure tyre pressures are set to the maximum pressure as prescribed on your vehicle's tyre placard.

A trained Zagame technician will be onsite to assist with any unanticipated issues but will not be responsible for rectification of any technical or mechanical issues which may thwart or prevent vehicle participation each day.

We strongly recommend having your vehicle inspected by your authorized Zagame Automotive service centre in the lead up to participation in this event.

PLEASE CONTACT YOUR ZAGAME AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE CENTRE TO BOOK YOUR CAR IN FOR ITS INSPECTION

Failure to have this pre-event inspection conducted may have warranty implications should any vehicle issues arise. Please contact your service advisor for more information.

Documentation & Scrutineering

Scrutineering is a mandatory and critical check of participating vehicles prior to the start of the rally to ensure they conform to the CAMS rules and safety regulations, which greatly align with normal roadworthiness criteria for the Zagame Tour category. If a participating vehicle violates the rules and regulations, it will not be able to participate in the Zagame Tour.

We will host 2 scrutineering and driver briefing sessions, as per below:

The documentation required is as follows:

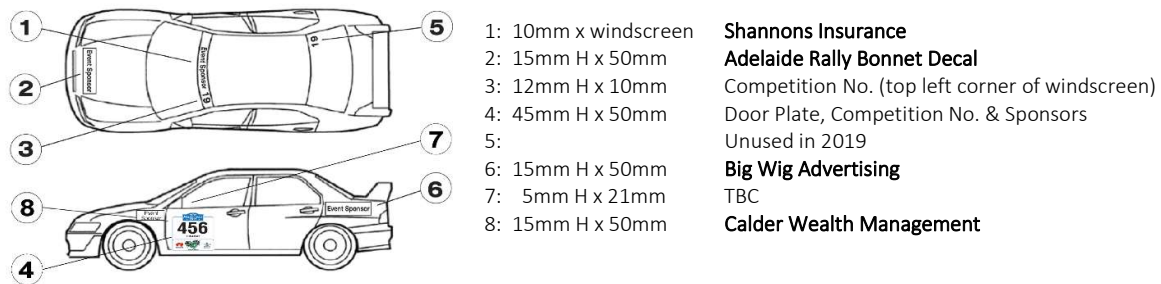
- Completed and signed Zagame Tour Form

- Copy of Drivers Licence for both Driver and Navigator
- Copy of the CAMS licence and CAMS affiliated Car Club Membership for both Driver and Navigator
 - If Driver and Navigator DON'T already have CAMS licences, CAMS LS2 Licence form to be completed
- Vehicle registration papers (proof of registration and CTP Insurance)

Rally Decals

Please note that event decals must be installed on participating vehicle before they pass scrutineering. Zagame Automotive will have signwriters onsite to install these at each of the above scrutineering sessions.

The location of such decals is outlined in the supplementary regulations and illustrated below.



General Safety during the rally

When on closed road stages participants **must not**:

- Overtake
- Stop on stage unless it's an emergency
- Drop back and accelerate
- Do burn outs
- Drive in the opposite direction
- Drive anywhere other than on the bitumen
- Extend limbs (hang arms outside of the car)
- Drive in a dangerous or erratic manner
- Disobey officials or Tour Leaders
- Exceed the limits imposed (80 kph or sign posted limits, whichever is higher)

At all times during the event, participants are to follow the rules and instructions dictated by the event and CAMS.

Participants must not deliberately disobey an official's direction to start the stage. This sort of activity, which may be an attempt to create a gap whereby the car can momentarily accelerate to catch the car in front, is forbidden. Stage officials will record the vehicle numbers of cars that may demonstrate this type of activity, and depending on the severity, exclusion from the event may occur.

During the Rally

The event will start each day at The Adelaide Showgrounds North Western Carpark, known as *parc ferme*.

Zagame Automotive will provide a breakfast pack each morning for participants. During the day, participants are supplied lunch along with coffee and refreshments at other planned stops.

Overnight vehicle parking

Vehicles will be stored overnight at The Adelaide Showground from Wednesday – Saturday. There will be security on the area from 6pm each evening with dedicated Zagame security on our vehicles.

Zagame Owners Dinner – Thursday 5 December

Enjoy an intimate, yet casual, dinner at the magnificent Magill Restaurant, Penfolds with other Zagame owners to share your experiences on Day 1 of the Adelaide Rally.

Interstate participants will be provided with transport between the Pullman Hotel and the restaurant.

Gouger Street Festival – Friday 6 December

This event invites participants to showcase their cars at the Gouger Street Festival as the final stage of the Adelaide Rally, Day 2. Zagame participants are welcome to enjoy the festivities at their own leisure, with celebrity drivers on stage, bands, activities and more.

Last year's attendance exceeded 14,720 people.

Note: You must return your vehicle to *parc ferme* at 9:30pm exactly at the conclusion of the event.

Finale Party – Saturday 7 December

This event includes all Zagame Tour cars A demonstrative Super Special Stage on Rundle Road is planned where the public can see the rally cars at full noise. Manufacturer displays on Rundle Street combine with motoring themed activities for kids and live music until 9:30pm.

On the final day of the Zagame Tour, your vehicle will be securely displayed in designated off-street parking at the East End Finale Party (East Terrace) whilst you enjoy exclusive Zagame corporate hospitality on Stag Lane, our exclusive Zagame VIP area, in the heart of the festivities, as more than 250 competitor and rally participants cross the finish line after you.

We will have security monitoring your vehicles during the festivities and overnight. Please note, your vehicle will need to be removed by 10:30am the following morning as normal parking fees will commence at this time.

Alternatively, participants can take their car home at the conclusion of the rally.

Accommodation

The Pullman is Adelaide's newest five-star hotel, located in the heart of the city. Situated within walking distance of the Gouger Street Party and East End Finale Party, it is the perfect base whilst in Adelaide.

Zagame Automotive guests will enjoy Deluxe Accommodation with full buffet breakfast each morning.

Transfers

For guests staying at The Pullman, transfers will be available each day for transport to/from *parc ferme*.

Transfers will also be available for guests attending the Zagame Owners Dinner on Thursday evening at Magill Restaurant.

Frequently Asked Questions

What speeds/activity will we be doing on the tight roads in the rally?

Zagame Tour travels in a group with cars spaced out evenly. This group travels at signposted limits or 80kmh, whichever is higher, however the roads are incredibly serpentine mountain roads which present a completely different experience when drivers have full use of both sides of the road. Sections like Corkscrew Rd are a series of hairpins climbing to a peak and make for a big shot of adrenaline, even in first and second gear!

The East End Finale Stage involves cars traversing the stage individually rather than in a tour group. A course will be set up on Rundle Road, which is a 28-metre-wide section of the original Adelaide Grand Prix circuit. Here a tight course will mean speeds are within event limits but you have an opportunity to make some noise for the thousands of spectators expected.

Can I get my Fire Extinguisher secured at the same time I have the decals applied at the Scrutineering & Driver Information Session?

No. This must be fitted to your vehicle prior to Scrutineering, during the vehicle pre-track inspection, with removal at the post event inspection. Please contact your local Service team to arrange your pre and post event vehicle inspections.

What if I get lost?

A Road Book is supplied with full instructions on directions, distances and times. Tour leaders and followers will also carry two-way radios, and SMS technology.

What happens regarding what position you leave within the tour packet? If there is someone slower placed in front, will they be moved?

This decision will be made at the discretion of the lead car (Drive Instructor). If you do have concerns with being held up, it is best you speak with the lead car.

If my car has a mechanical issue prior to the rally and cannot be fixed in time, do I receive a refund?

Refund requests must be in writing, if they are received before 1 November, then the amount paid is refunded minus \$1,000. If notification is received after 1 November, 50% of the official entry fee is credited to the 2020 event, the remainder is not refundable.

Do I need a Navigator? Or can I do this on my own?

Yes. It is compulsory you use the same Navigator for all three days of the rally.

Does my Navigator have to be over 18 years of age?

Yes, your Navigator must hold a full driver's license and a L2S CAMS license. Or may have a temporary, single event L2S licence provided for the Rally Tour should you require one.

Does the Navigator need to attend Scrutineering?

No, however they must attend one of the Driver Information & Briefing sessions.

Can the Navigator share the drive at all over the 3 days?

No.

Will there be Service Technicians on the road?

Zagame Automotive technicians will support the packet with some tools. If it is possible to rectify a breakdown

or use diagnostic equipment roadside, they will do so. Tow trucks are also floating if required. Any roadside or mechanical assistance required for your car is to be paid by the owner.

What wear and tear can I expect to my car?

There is a small risk of stone chip damage on some stages of the rally. If this is a concern, we recommend you invest in a paint wrap for your vehicle.
